



The building in Radetzkystraße was constructed between 1981 and 1986 according to the designs of architect Peter Czernin. Due to its octagonal shape, the building is also known as the "Octoneum". For the artistic design inside and outside the Federal Office building on Radetzkystrasse, casts of Anton Hanak's works were installed. One of the most impressive is certainly the so-called Giant or Goliath in the entrance hall. The "Flaming Flags" by Gero Schwanberg on Vordere Zollamtsstraße are a symbol of Austria's nine federal states.¹

The venue is centrally located in Vienna and is accessible by highly-frequented public transport lines.

Transportation

Public Transport

Vienna has a public transport system that makes it easy and affordable to get around the city. With 5 metro-, 29 tram- and 127 bus lines, you can get just about anywhere within no time at all. The lines operate seven days a week from 5 a.m. to half past 12 p.m., with metro lines operating through the night on weekends. Routes can be found best via Google Maps or the "ÖBB Scooty" App. Please note that every ride needs a ticket - You can buy them online or at the counters. A single ride will cost you € 2,40, a weekly ticket about € 17,-. For more information, see https://www.wienerlinien.at/web/wlen/tickets

City Airport Train - CAT

Non stop train between the Airport and the City.

The CAT stopes at the **Station "Wien Mitte Landstraße"**: approximately ten minutes' walk along "Hintere Zollamtsstraße" or "Vordere Zollamtsstraße"

Underground

- **Line U1** (metro station "**Schwedenplatz**"): approximately ten minutes walk along "Franz-Josefs-Kai" and "Uraniastraße" in the direction of "Radetzkybrücke";
- **Line U3** (metro station "**Landstraße**"): approximately twelve minutes' walk along "Hintere Zollamtsstraße" or "Vordere Zollamtsstraße";
- **Line U4** (metro station "**Landstraße**"): approximately ten minutes' walk along "Hintere Zollamtsstraße" or "Vordere Zollamtsstraße".

Tramway

- Line 2 (tramway station "Julius-Raab-Platz"): approximately ten minutes' walk along "Uraniastraße" in the direction of "Radetzkybrücke";
- Line 0 and 1 (tramway station "Hintere Zollamtsstraße").

<u>Taxi</u>

Taxi services are common in Vienna and available on Uber, at taxi stands or under +43 1 40 100 or +43 1 31 300.

The **repair station** is located next to the main entrance on the right


